#### Réamhfhocal an Phríomhoide/Principal's Foreword

A Chairde Uilig,

Dear Parents, Pupils and Staff,

As we approach the end of our first term at Scoil Mhuire, I would like to wish everyone a very happy and peaceful Christmas. It has been a very busy, eventful start to the 2023/24 School Year.

Fr. Michael McLoughlin, a great friend to Scoil Mhuire for the last 21 years, left us in early September to take up a new post as parish priest of Salthill. Fr. Martin Whelan was appointed parish priest of Moycullen in his place. Our Bishop Michael Duignan formally introduced Fr. Martin to his new parish on Saturday 16th December. On the sporting front, our Senior Boys Gaelic Football team lifted the Annual Bish Cup in September. Our Accelerated Reader Programme, the focus of last tears School Self-Evaluation (SSE) enters its second year. The focus of this year's SSE will be Wellbeing. The Colourstrings Music Programme, delivered by Katri and Peggy from Maoin Cheoil na Gaillimhe, continues this year, as do our Swimming Lessons in Leisureland for 3rd to 6th Classes. We were successful in securing a generous grant from Galway Wind Park Community Benefit Fund and are in the process of kitting out a Sensory Space, which will be of benefit to so many children in our school.

A new Primary Curriculum Framework, developed by the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment, is being introduced by the Department of Education, beginning with the new Primary Mathematics Curriculum, which will involve our school being closed for staff training on Tuesday 23rd January 2024.

After several post-pandemic attempts to resurrect our Parents' Association, we finally have a Parents' Association Committee in place. We held a very successful Book Fair in November, which raised over €2000 for our school library. Jennifer Asada came to our school to teach French to 4th and 5th Classes as part of the Say Yes to Languages Programme (teaching and learning of a foreign language will form part of the new Primary Curriculum.) 4th Classes are taking part in this year's Junior Entrepreneur Programme. Our Board of Management, whose term ended on 30th November 2023, held its final meeting on Thursday 9th November. Our new Board will held its first meeting on Thursday 21st December. An Taoiseach Leo Varadkar briefly visited Scoil Mhuire, having officially opened the new Moycullen Bypass on Monday 11th December, and took off from our school yard in an Air Corps Helicopter!

Our New School Building Project is at Stage 2B and the Board of Management hopes to appoint a contractor early in the New Year, with works beginning soon thereafter.

As you can see, Scoil Mhuire is a very busy place. We hope that our teachers, our SNAs, our support staff and all of our pupils will enjoy a nice relaxing rest over the Christmas and return to school full of energy and enthusiasm on Monday 8th January 2024 for an exciting new school term in Scoil Mhuire.



#### **Scoil Mhuire Student Council**



We have just set up our first ever Student Council in Scoil Mhuire. It is made of up pupils from  $3^{rd}$  to  $6^{th}$  Class and we have had two meetings so far this term. T

The four elected Sixth Class pupils have the roles of Chairperson (Sophie Shaughnessy), Deputy Chairperson (Aodhán O' Neill), Secretary (Cleo Palmer) and Communications and Media Officer (Paul Rodgers).

Members of the council will meet at least once a month to share their class ideas, discuss issues that affect their life at school as well as being involved in some decision making and organisation of activities and events during the year.

Pupil voice, responsibility and involvement in all aspects of school life are really important to us in Scoil Mhuire and all children will be able to share their ideas through a class Google Form or suggestion box which will be circulated before meetings. Fifth and Sixth Class council members are linked to each of the Infant to Second Classes to gather their ideas and provide feedback after meetings.

# Scoil Mhuire School Attendance Campaign

Earlier this year, the Minister for Education launched the National School Attendance Campaign (NSAC). The campaign, a Tusla Education Support Services and Department of Education initiative, seeks to promote the importance of school attendance. Before COVID-19, attendance in Scoil Mhuire was excellent. Unfortunately, attendance figures have disimproved in the aftermath of the pandemic.

In the 2018/19 School Year 20 pupils were absent from school on 20 or more days. Last year, the 2022/23 School Year, 57 pupils were absent from school on 20 or more days. In the 2018/19 School Year we recorded a school-wide total of 3,185 days of absence from school. Last year, the 2022/23 School Year, that figure was 4,882 days.

We will be producing a new School Attendance Strategy, with the aim of improving attendance and punctuality in our school. We will be in touch in January for your feedback and opinions. As parents/guardians, you can help us to improve attendance and punctuality in our school by:

- Not taking holidays during school term
- Sending your child to school when he/she is well enough to attend school
- Consulting with and cooperating with the school in resolving any issues around your child's reluctance to attend school
- Ensuring that your child arrives to school on time, i.e. before 9:00 a.m.
- Avoiding, if at all possible, withdrawing your child from school early, i.e. before 1:30 p.m. (Infants) or 2:30 p.m. (All other classes)

Although we really want to see our attendance figures return to what they once were, if a child is genuinely sick and unwell, i.e. nausea, vomiting, fever, sneezing & coughing and feeling unwell and miserable, he/she should not be at school.

#### KEEPING OUR PUPILS SAFE ONLINE

We have recently invested in **Senso Class Cloud** Software for our suite of 65 chromebooks and assistive technology devices in Scoil Mhuire. Senso cloud is an internet-based safeguarding, monitoring, and management tool. With this software, we can take control of the class and keep students focussed on the task in hand. We can view the screens of multiple devices simultaneously, share documents, block distractions and much more.

#### In Scoil Mhuire, we use Senso to:

#### Safeguard our pupils.

Senso helps us to protect users by proactively monitoring school devices and indicating safeguarding concerns to the relevant staff. Senso flags users who may be vulnerable or at-risk and users who may pose a risk to others, as well as any inappropriate, off-task or harmful behaviour.

#### Manage Lessons.

We save time by getting the class where we want them as quickly as possible, we can push out a website or application to the whole group or selected machines. Keeping the class on task and ready to start work from the get-go.

#### Gain Student Feedback.

Send out a question for the class, small group, or individual in 2 easy steps. With instant feedback within the same window, we can act on the feedback straight away.

#### Minimise Distractions in Class.

When attention is required and distraction is not, we can turn the internet on or off or alternatively lock the pupil's screens so that the attention is back where we need it.


# **Junior Infants**

First class Ms Concannon we are really looking forward to the Christmas! We all had turns painting and decorating our class-room windows using glass markers, paint and stencils.










We also painted and made Arctic penguins! We made colourful Christmas trees using crepe paper and paint!


